Year 6 trip to Crucial Crew at the Lamex Stadium

Here is a report from two Year 6 children about their class trip to Crucial Crew last week:

"We went to Crucial Crew and we learned about how to perform CPR, railway safety, fire hazards, the difference between mental and physical health, knife crime and online safety.

CPR. We learned the steps of how to perform CPR. You look for danger then check to see if they are breathing by opening their airway and feeling with your cheek. If not, you will need to perform CPR on them at a rate of about 100 beats per minute.

Railway Safety. We learned how to stay safe on the railway. We found out that electricity can jump at you and electrocute you.

Fire hazards. We learned about fire hazards and the consequences of ignoring them. We had to list all of the fire hazards in a room.

Mental and physical health. We played games outside about how to stay fit physically and mentally. We had to create a rugby, football and golf player with certain qualities.

Knife crime. We learned how knife crime affects you and others. We learned about the consequences of commiting a knife crime and watched a video about what happens if you go to prison.

Overall, Year 6 had a great time at the Lamex Stadium with Crucial Crew and found out a lot of information.
