





# **Early Years Curriculum**

#### Intent

Here at St Nicholas C of E Primary and Nursery School, we believe the Early Years Foundation Stage is of the utmost importance to children and is not only where a child's first steps in education take place, it is also the basis for long term well-being and lifelong learning. We aspire to ensure our Early Years curriculum is inclusive and provides aspiring opportunities for all who attend here. We believe our practitioners directly shape children's futures by following children's interest and building on their personal lives. Here at St Nicholas, we aim for all children to develop a passion for learning both inside and out of the classroom. Our curriculum includes increasing knowledge, phonic skills, developing a wide vocabulary, British values and an understanding of healthy lifestyle. As well as this, we develop the three prime areas in EYFS; Communication and Language, Physical Development, Personal, Social and Emotional Development and the four specific areas within EYFS; Literacy, Mathematics, Understanding the World and Expressive Arts and Design.

## <u>Implementation</u>

We have designed a curriculum for our Nursery and Reception children that is relevant to our children and builds strong foundations for learning. These are underpinned by the recurring themes in topics and all feed into the Primary Knowledge needed to ensure all children are able to succeed when accessing our Curriculum in KS1 and 2. These overviews include suggested key vocabulary, concepts, texts and ideas that are taught within that topic, whilst ensuring progression and challenge. These are revised based on the individual needs of each cohort. This is to ensure we meet the needs of pupils with EAL, SEND, PP and those who are from vulnerable families. These overviews also detail potential visitors, trips and events that promote cultural capital and widen life experiences. Throughout EYFS, we cover all the areas of learning, both inside and out during continuous provision, planned enhanced provision and planned adult-directed activities. Our provision is language rich and provides challenge to all our learners.

Reflecting on assessment is how we ensure that the EYFS environment and planning is responsive to pupils' needs. Practitioners are trained by leaders to ensure they understand the areas of learning through a clear induction process and ongoing monitoring and evaluation, where support is put in place as needed. All staff are trained to communicate effectively, promote positive learning attitudes and support children's development and enjoyment. We work to ensure parents are actively involved through the use of Tapestry, weekly newsletters, Share & Learn mornings and the parent workshops we offer.
