"Year 5 and 6 enjoyed an electrifying day at the Stevenage STEM Discovery Centre last week. Y6 made buzz wires, using their circuit knowledge from our class learning. Y5 extended their knowledge of the planetary system by making a phase box. Both classes enjoyed a science or magic investigation where skewers were poked through inflated balloons, sitting on a cushion of nails - well done Mrs Biucchi - and how heat can shrink paper. We were also lucky enough to see the Mars Rover in action on the Mars landscape, the scientists working were more than happy to put on a show!"
